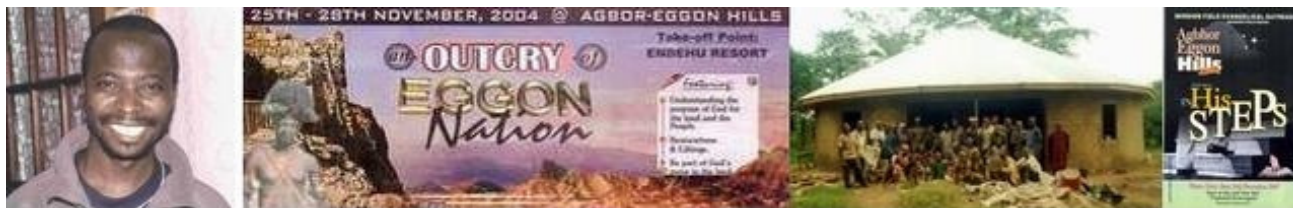


## News from Naphtali in Nigeria – October 2007



We bring greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ from Nasarawa-Eggon.

The past few months has been quite fruitful with many challenges. As Paul wrote in 2nd Cor. 4:1 "Therefore, being engaged in this service through divine mercy, we are not despondent". This has been our consolation.

The first half of the year we built a Prayer House on the Mountain where we have our yearly convention.

We had three prayer conferences with great testimonies.

One of the prayer conferences was for the elderly ones. The youngest amongst them is in his late seventies. Tears ran down my eyes seeing this old people hugging and praising God for allowing them to see each other again.



Some of them had not seen each other more that 30 years now. Two cannot even see again, but are bubbling in the Lord. The prayer meeting lasted for 7 hours.

Discipleship groups are ongoing in various villages – we are quite encouraged by people's response and growth.

An Engineer from one of the villages who work in the State Capital was thanking me. He said he that because he is educated he thought he was supposed to teach his mother to pray; but to his greatest surprise when the mother visited his house, the mother was the one teaching them the principles of prayer. He said "Am greatly challenged - God bless you".

During June and July I was in South Africa - with O.M - Global Challenge. It was quite fruitful. On one to one evangelism I led 19 people to Christ who said the sinner's prayer.

The first was an army young man called Njoko - a Zulu.

The second was one of our team members - a young lady from Cape town who in tears submit her life to Christ through the challenge. We saw her growth tremendously. Praise God.

I preached in Church in Pacalddop - in a congregational church - we saw both elders and about 30 others of them sobbing and coming forward to submit their lives to the lordship of Jesus Christ - I wept too - for I was so touched by the genuine response of the people. The testimony is that, that is the first time such a thing has happened in the history of that Church. Pray that the fruit will remain.

In August/September, I had Revival Meeting for 3 days with the University of Jos where we saw great harvest and the touch of God. Students repenting and confessing their sins. And also at the Nasarawa State University where they are planning to buy a bus for evangelism. They invited the big time politicians but not even one come. God did it His own way. After I finished preaching - students donated their mobile phones, jackets, wrist watch and a lady remove her shoe to give that it be sold to buy the bus. I was so touched that I was in tears throughout. I was saying this is Revival. I will be there again 28th/10/2007 to preach.

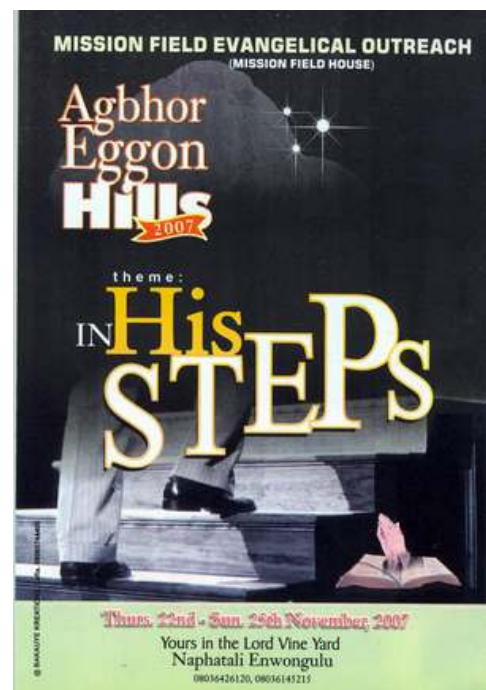
Also on the 26-30th of September, 2007, I was in Agyaragu for a Revival/Crusade where we saw great harvest. Many people gave their lives to Christ and they into discipleship right now.

### Pray Points

- That we will overcome any attack of the enemy.
- For the right people to be recruited to the school of mission.

### NEEDS

- I am presently handicapped of transport, the two vehicles we have broke down and need total overhauling. That will cost me about One Hundred and Forty Thousand Naira (Approx £550 / \$1124)
- Our yearly convention is coming up from 22-25/11/2007. We need resources for feeding, printing bible studies materials and more speakers and generator to be able to serve the meeting. Last year we were over 3,000 people and this year our heart is stretching for between 5 to 6,000 people.
- Ten mega phones for small groups studies and morning cry in the villages. That will cost seven thousand naira for each (£28 / \$56 each)
